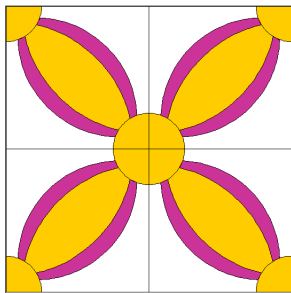


Midget Blocks—Block 154



Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

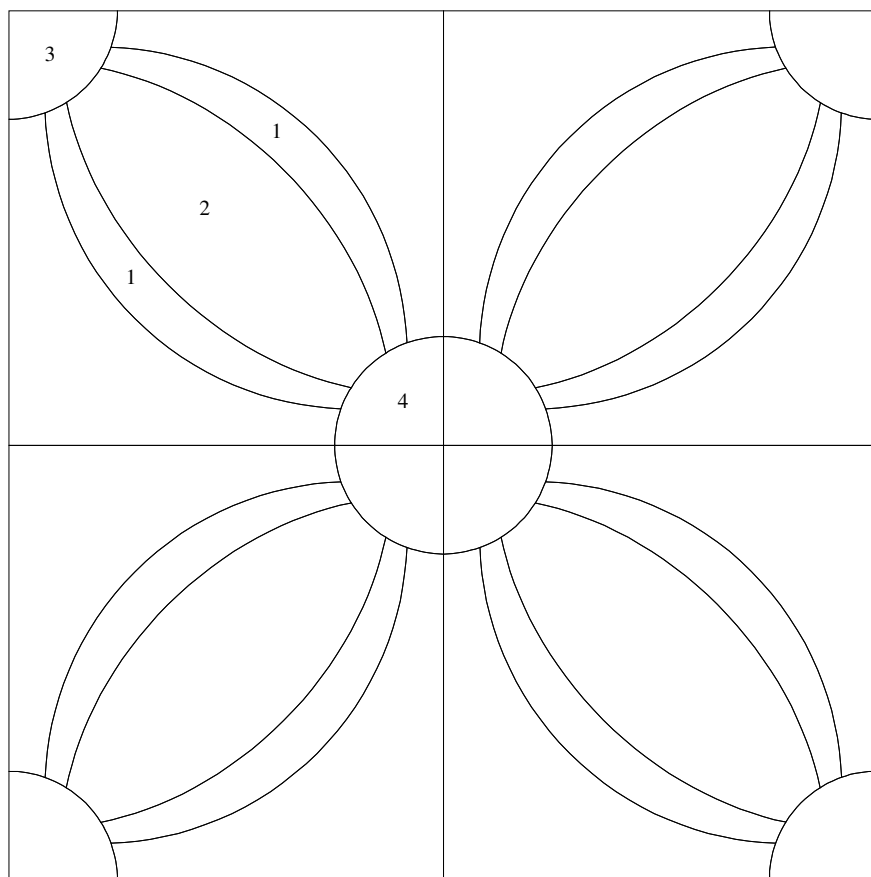
Most of the blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a purple solid, yellow solid and the off-white background fabric.

Job's Tears - 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the eighth block from the left in the sixth row.

This block is easiest to construct using hand or machine piecing or applique

- This block was traditionally a pieced block. You can make templates for hand piecing from the block drawing below. I would rather applique the block by making four smaller sections and sewing them together after the applique is completed.
- To make the applique easier, applique the purple slivers in each section as one melon shape. Applique the yellow melon on top and finish with the corner quarter circles.



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This line should
measure 1" after
printing pattern.
