

Midget Blocks—Block 127

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.


Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using medium green, dark green solid and the background fabric.


Lozenge Tree- 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the eleventh block from the left in the thirteenth row.

This block is well suited for foundation piecing

- Foundation paper piece sections A—O
- Use pieces P-T as templates for cutting
- Begin sewing the foundation paper pieced sections by sewing sections A, B and C together to form a triangle.
- Repeat this four more times using sections D, E, F / G, H, I / J, K, L / M, N, O.







Sew background piece R to tree piece Q



Sew remaining diamond to the K/Q unit



Sew background piece P to opposite side of piece Q



- Sew the four diamond section to the diamond/trunk section
- Sew the S and T background triangles to the top left and right corners competing the block.







Your unfinished block should measure 5"
