



Midget Blocks—Block 130

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own. Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using medium peach, orange and the background fabric.

Sunbeam 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the sixth block from the left in the sixteenth row.

This block is well suited for machine piecing and hand applique

- Cut background square 6" (trim to 5" after completing your applique)
- Cut four "D" from medium peach.
- Cut four "B" from medium peach.
- Cut one "C" from orange.
- Sew the B and D pieces together like you would for a Dresden Plate block.
- Applique the B/D plate to the background square.
- Applique center C to complete the block.

This line should
measure 1" after
printing pattern.

Your unfinished block should measure 5"
