

## Midget Blocks—Block 136

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.


Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a variety of prints, blue solid and the background fabric.

#### Letha's Electric Fan- 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the eleventh block from the left in the twelfth row.

This block is well suited for a combination of foundation piecing, machine piecing and applique.

- Foundation paper piece the four arc sections of the block using a variety of print fabrics.
- Cut four 2 1/8" x 3 3/8" pieces from your background fabric.
- Applique an arc on each of these pieces as shown.



• Cut one 1 5/8" square of background fabric. Hand piece the appliqued rectangles around the square stopping and starting your sewing at the beginning and end of each seam line.



• Cut one template E from blue solid fabric and applique to the center completing the block. block.





Your unfinished block should measure 5"


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
