

Midget Blocks—Block 166

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Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of the blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a pink and green solid, and cream solid background fabric.

Compass & Chain - 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the eighth block from the left in the fifth row.

This block can be constructed using a variety of techniques but I think hand piecing is best. I'd print this page on freezer paper and cut out the shapes to use as templates.

The 1/4" seam allowance is NOT included on templates. Add your seam allowance when cutting your fabric for hand or machine piecing.

Pink solid


• Cut eight A.

Green solid

- Cut four B
- Cut four D
- Cut four I
- Cur four H

- Cut twelve C
- · Cut four F
- · Cut four G






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
This line should measure 1" after printing pattern.



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
