

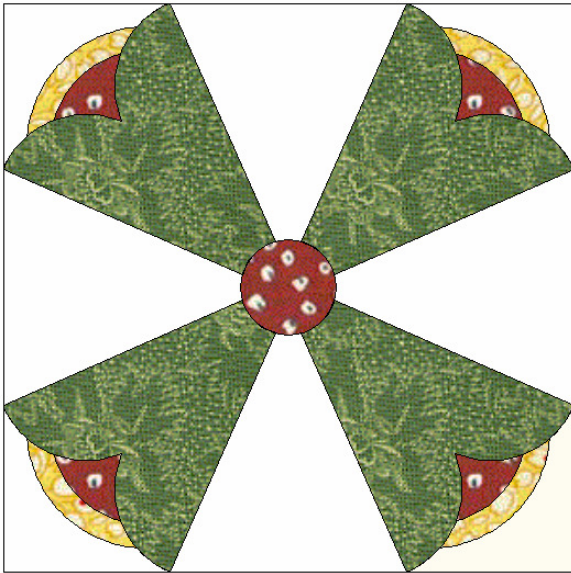
## Midget Blocks—Block 29

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using four fabrics; a red solid, green solid, yellow print and the background fabric

### Grandmother's Tulip 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the ninth block from the left in the second row.



This block is well suited for needle-turn appliqué. Cut a background fabric square 5 1/2" – 6". I like to cut my appliqué backgrounds larger than the needed. After completing the appliqué you can trim the block down to the required 5" unfinished size. 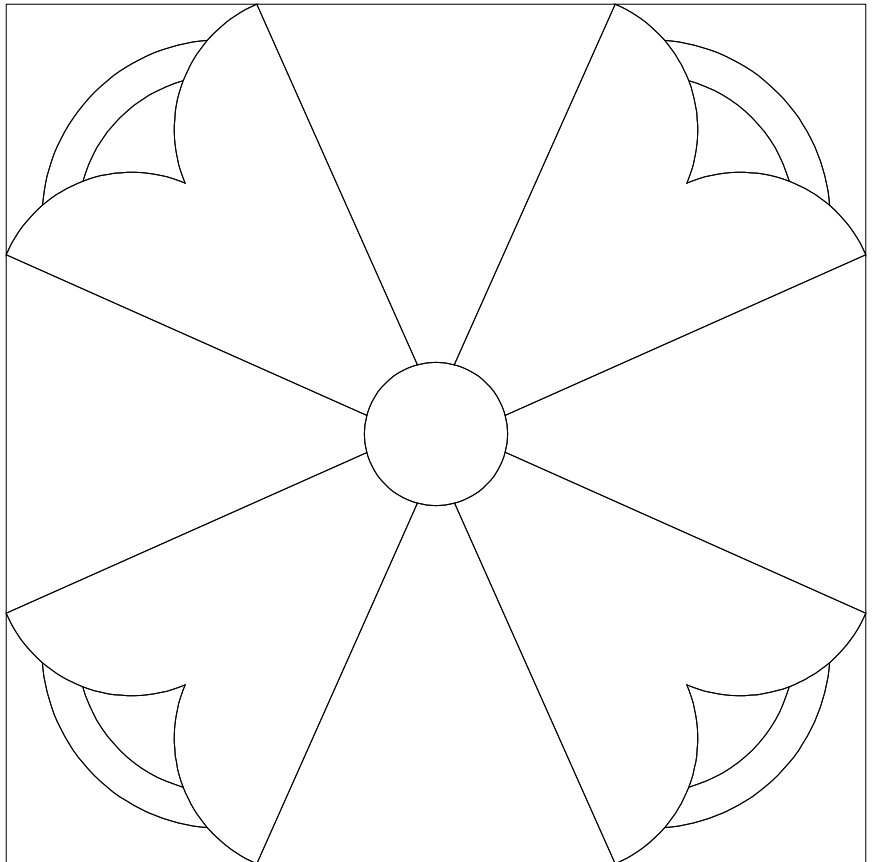
Use the full size block drawing to the right for making your appliqué templates if using traditional hand or machine appliqué.

The yellow part of the buds is appliquéd first, followed by the red part of the buds.

The green leaf sections come next, and the red center circle completes the block.

Trim your block to the unfinished size.

Unfinished size of your block should be a 5" square.
