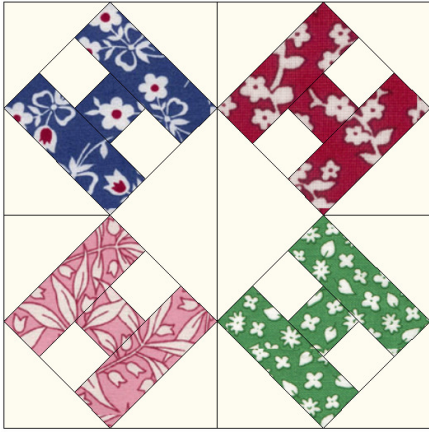


Midget Blocks—Block 36



Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using five fabrics; a red solid, blue solid, green solid, purple solid and the background fabric.

4 H Club—4 1/2"

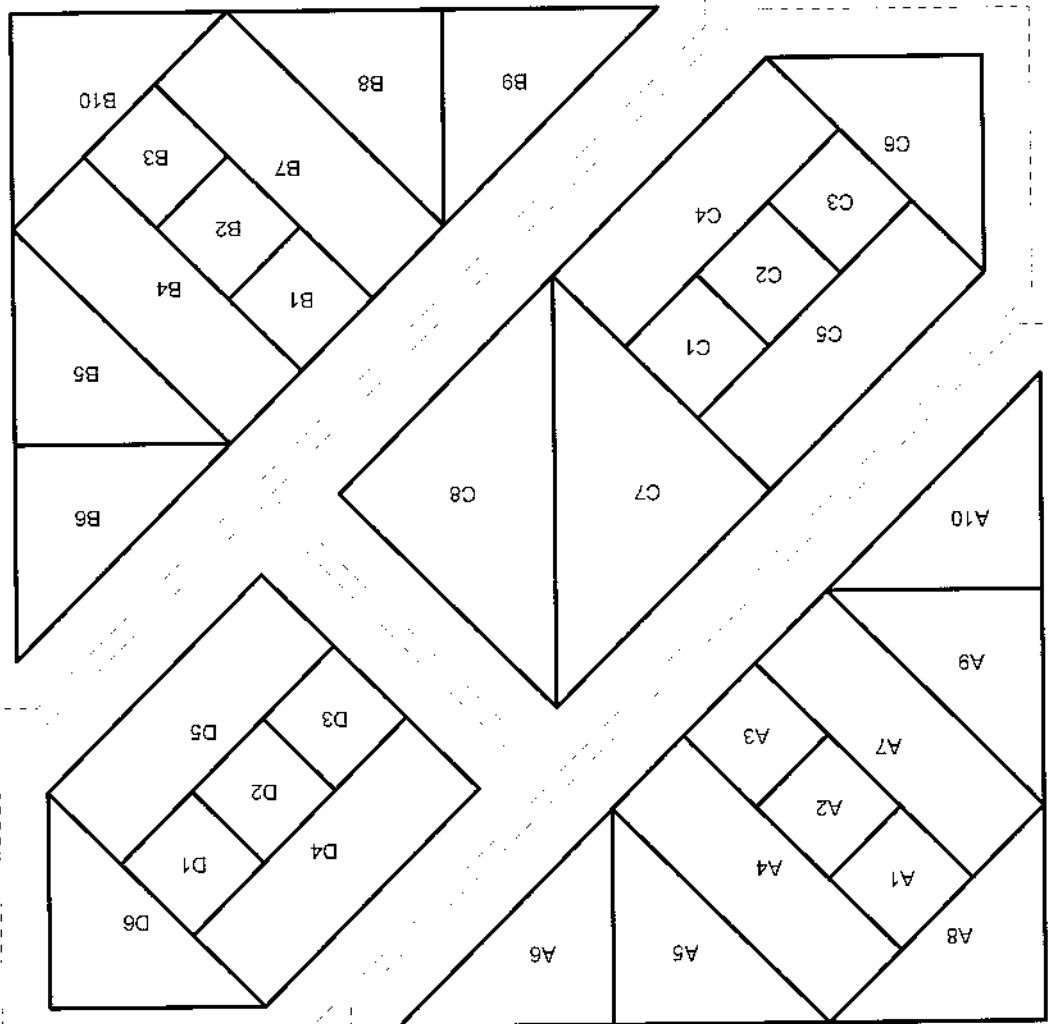
In the antique quilt this block is the fourth block from the left in the ninth row.

This block is easiest to construct if you use foundation paper piecing. A line was added down the center of the block to aid in construction.

Foundation paper piece each section of the block.

Sew the sections together to complete the block.

Your unfinished block should measure 5".
