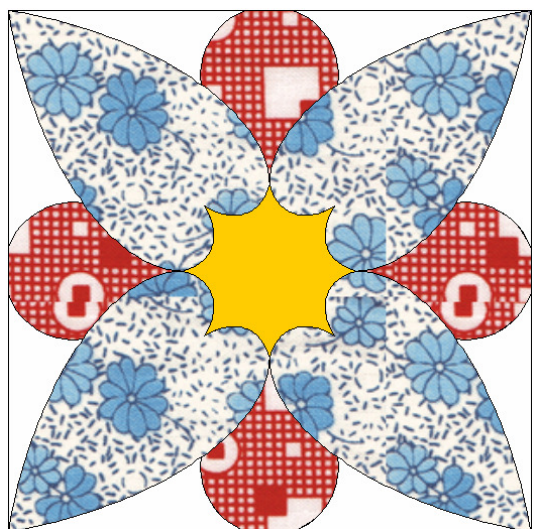


Midget Blocks—Block 38



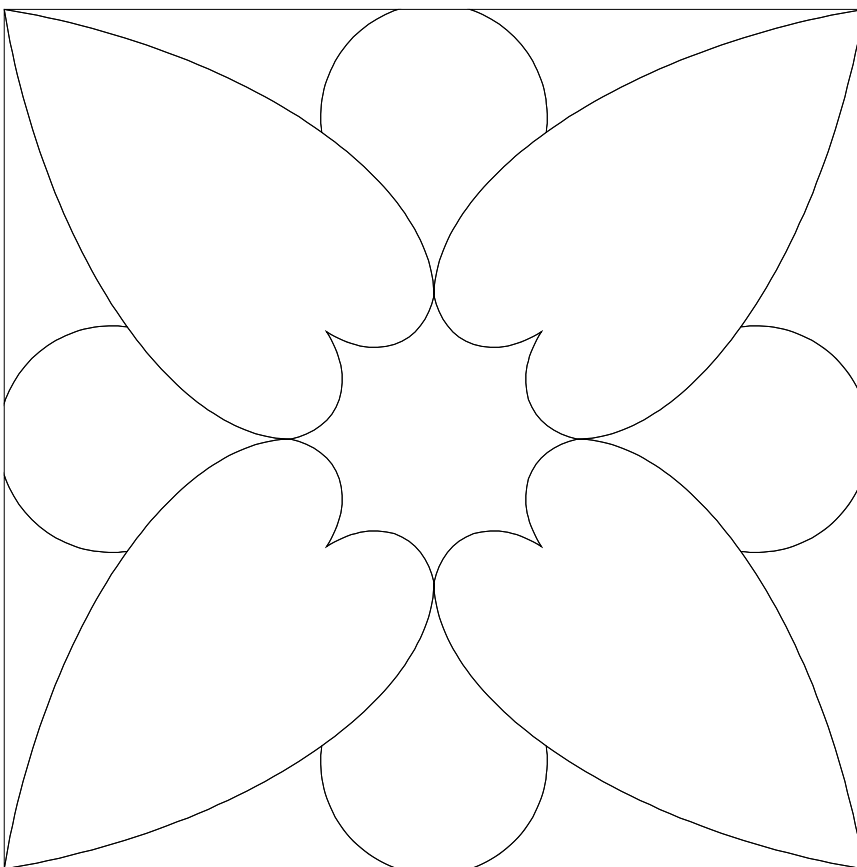
Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a blue print, a red print, a yellow solid and the background fabric.

Garden Beauty—4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the third block from the left in the fourth row.

1. From your background fabric, cut a 6" square.
2. Make appliqué templates from the line drawing of the heart and circular shape pieces.
3. From your yellow fabric, cut a square that measures
4. From your red print cut four of the circular shape pieces.
5. From your blue print cut four of the heart shape pieces.
6. Center the yellow square on the background square and baste in place.
7. Using your favorite appliqué method, applique the red print circular pieces to the background.
8. Applique the blue print hearts to the background.
9. Trim the excess background fabric so the unfinished size of your block is 5".



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
