

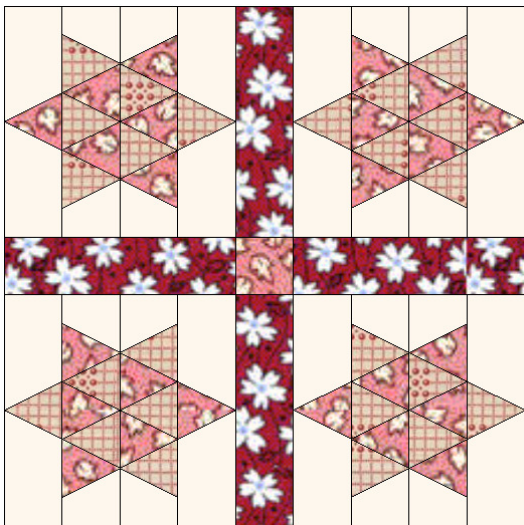
Midget Blocks—Block 43

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using two pink prints and a red print.

Sawtooth—4 1/2"

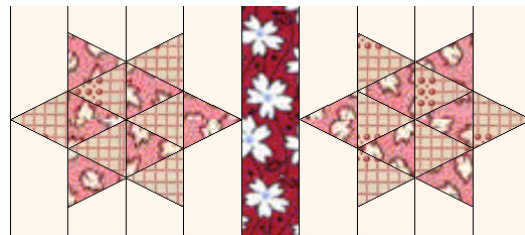
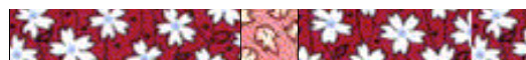
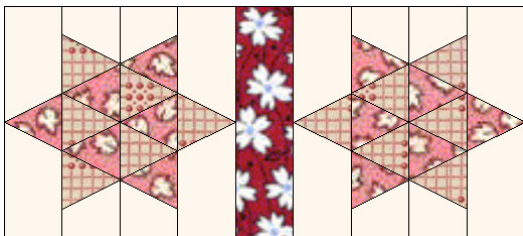
In the antique quilt this block is the second block from the left in the sixth row.



This block is easiest to construct using foundation paper piecing. This is another four section block but this time remember the colors in the sections alternate and you have sashing fabric between the sections.

1. You'll be sewing the block from left to right in two rows with the sashing section "N" between them.

Your unfinished block should measure 5".
