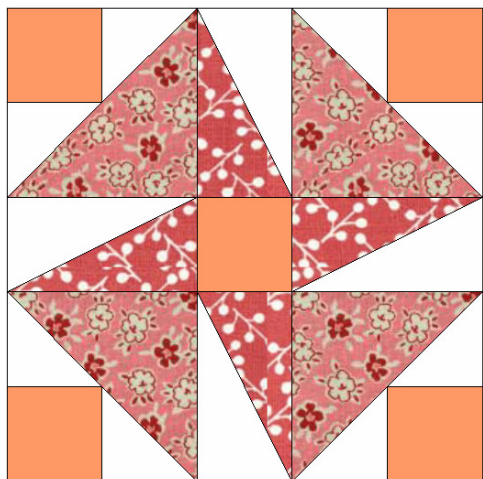


Midget Blocks—Block 47



Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a pink print, darker pink solid, peach solid and the background fabric.

Crazy Ann—4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the sixth block from the left in the ninth row.

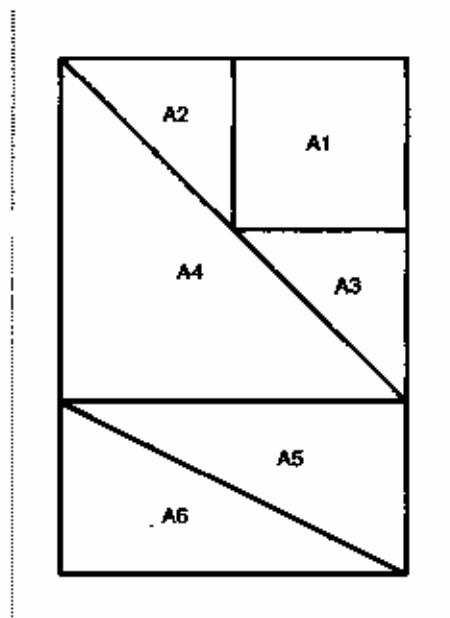
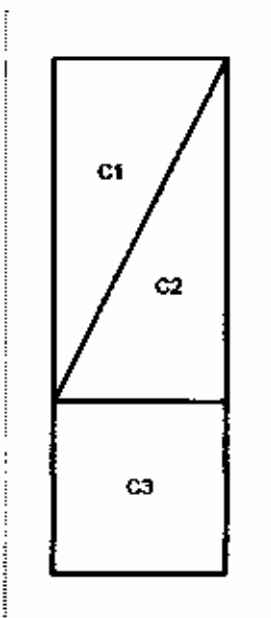
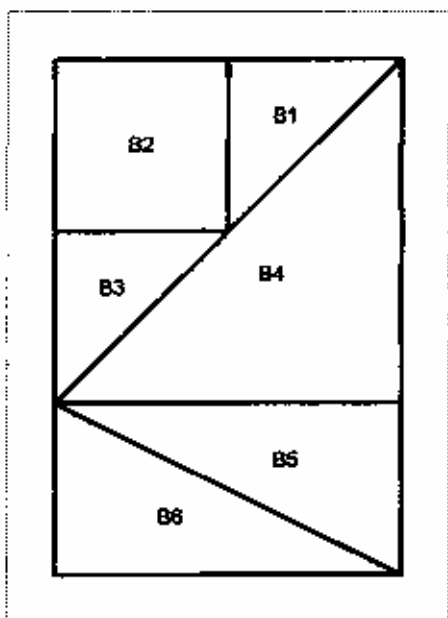
This block is easiest to construct using foundation piecing.

1. The first thing we need to do is foundation paper piece each of the sections that make up the block.

2. After the foundation paper pieced sections are completed, sew unit B to C.

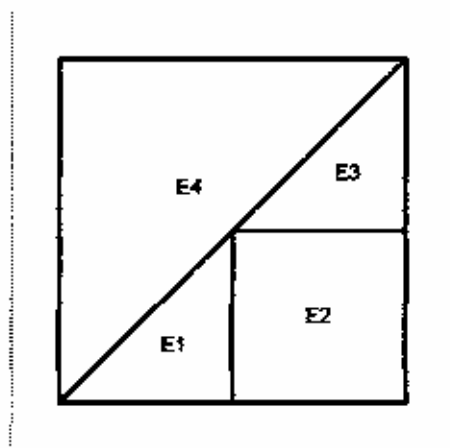
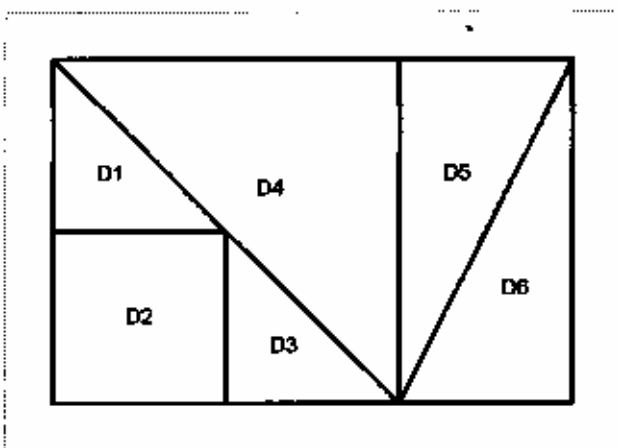
3. Sew the B/C unit to unit A. You now have half of the block together.

4. Sew unit D to E. You now have the second half of the block together.



Complete the block by sewing the two rows together.

Your unfinished block should measure 5".
