

Midget Blocks—Block 48

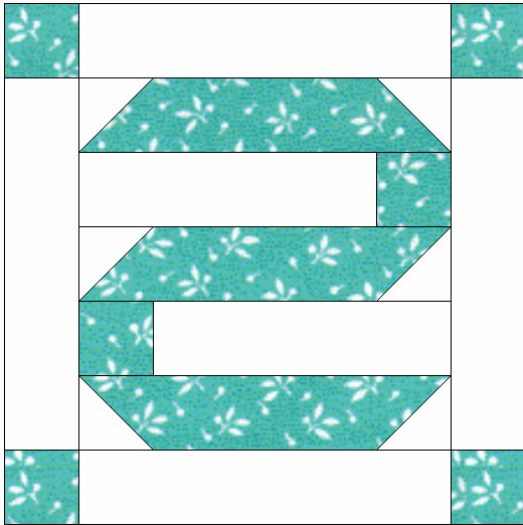
Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a turquoise solid and the background fabric.

Mountain Road—4 1/2"

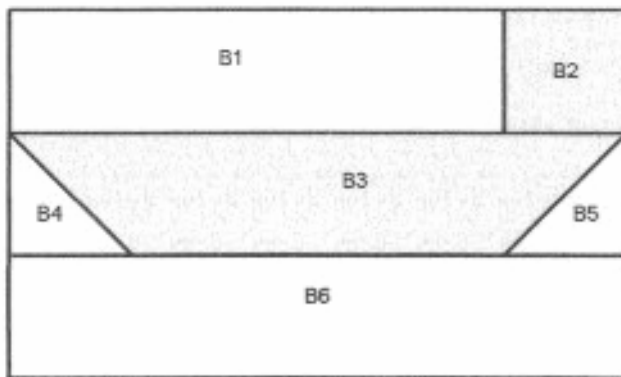
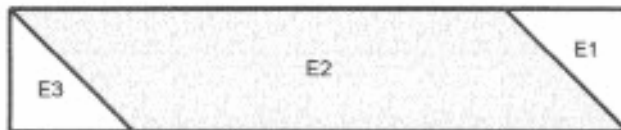
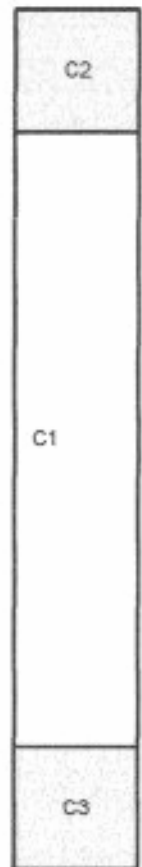
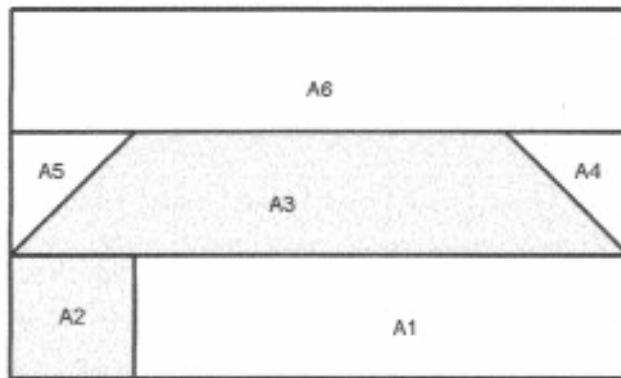
In the antique quilt this block is the second block from the left in the eleventh row.

This block is easiest to construct using foundation piecing.



1. The first thing to do is foundation paper piece each of the sections that make up the block.
2. After the foundation paper pieced sections are completed, sew unit A to E.
3. Sew the A/E unit to unit B.
4. Sew unit C to one side of the center A/E/B section.
5. Sew unit D to the other side.

Your unfinished block should measure 5".



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
