

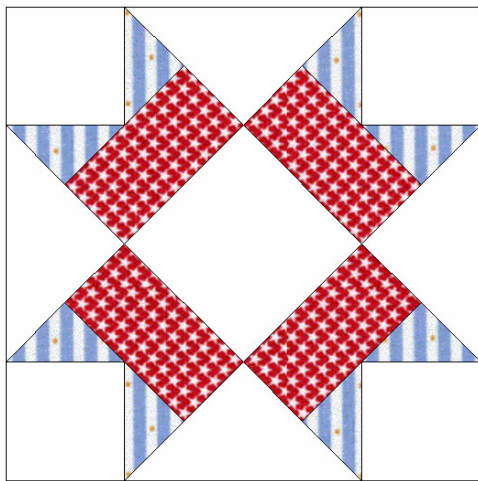
Midget Blocks—Block 50

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using three fabrics; a red print fabric, a stripe and the background fabric.

4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the second block from the left in the ninth row.

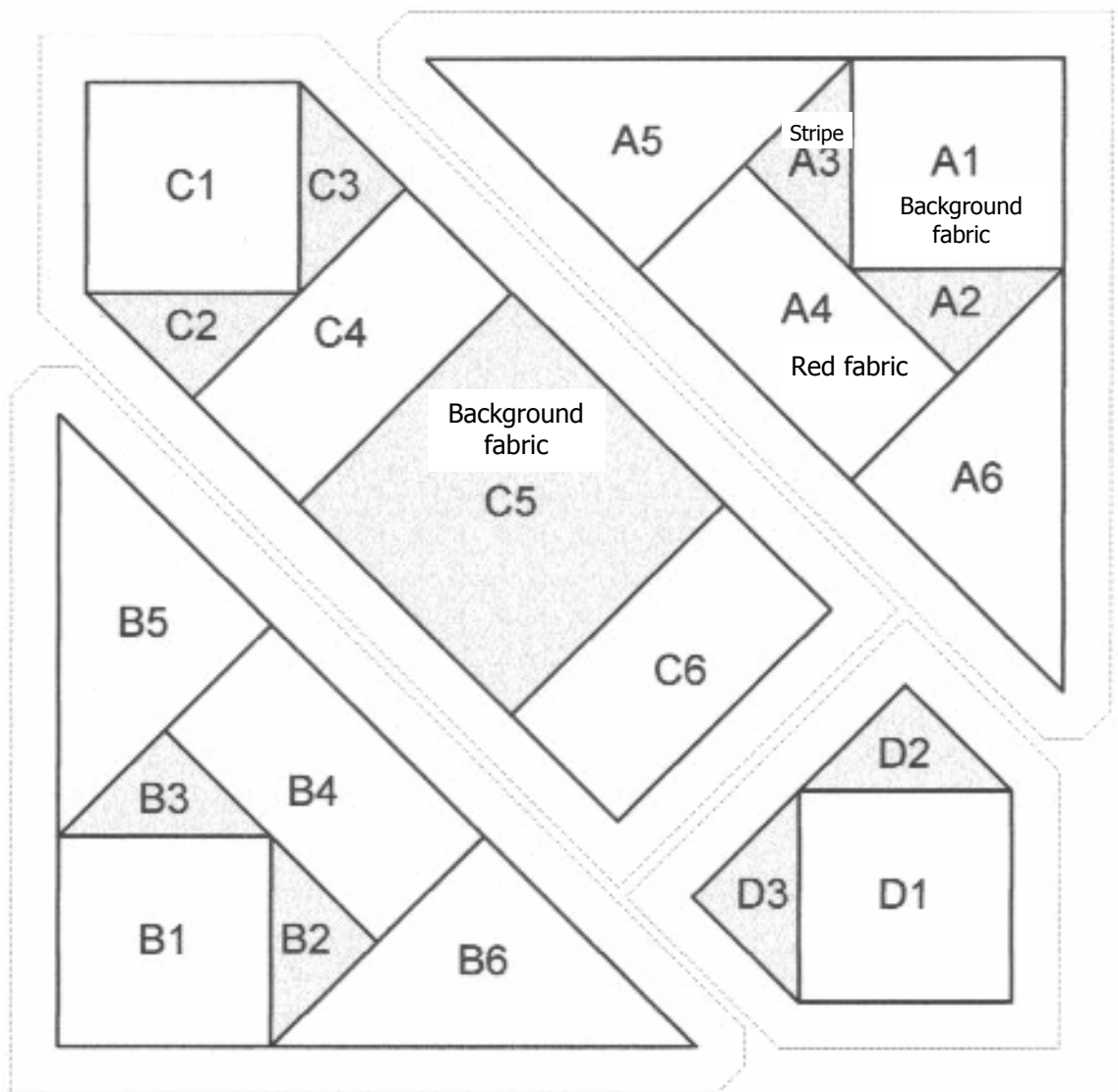


This block is well suited for a combination of machine and hand piecing.

1. This block is quite easy to foundation paper piece. Foundation paper piece sections A-B-C and D.
2. Sew section C and D together.
3. Complete the block by sewing sections A and B to the center diagonal strip.

Your unfinished block should measure 5"
