


Midget Blocks—Block 56


Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

This block is not in the original quilt. I had lots of requests for it when it appeared in a posting on the site. It would be a good substitution for one of the very complex blocks.

Tulips-4 1/2"

- 1. From your background fabric, cut a 6" square.
- 2. Make appliqué templates from the line drawing of the tulip and leaf pieces.
- 3. From your lavender print fabric, cut one tulip.
- 4. From your melon print cut one tulip.
- 5. From your green print cut two leaves.
- **6.** Using your favorite appliqué method, appliqué the pieces to the background.
- 7. Choose an embroidery floss that matches your green print fabric.
- **8.** Using 3 strands of floss, embroider the stems using an outline stitch.
- **9.** Trim the excess background fabric so the unfinished size of your block is 5".





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
