

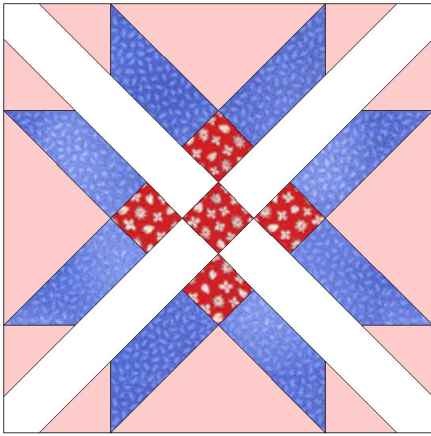
Midget Blocks—Block 69

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a red solid, blue solid, cream solid and a pink solid for the background fabric.

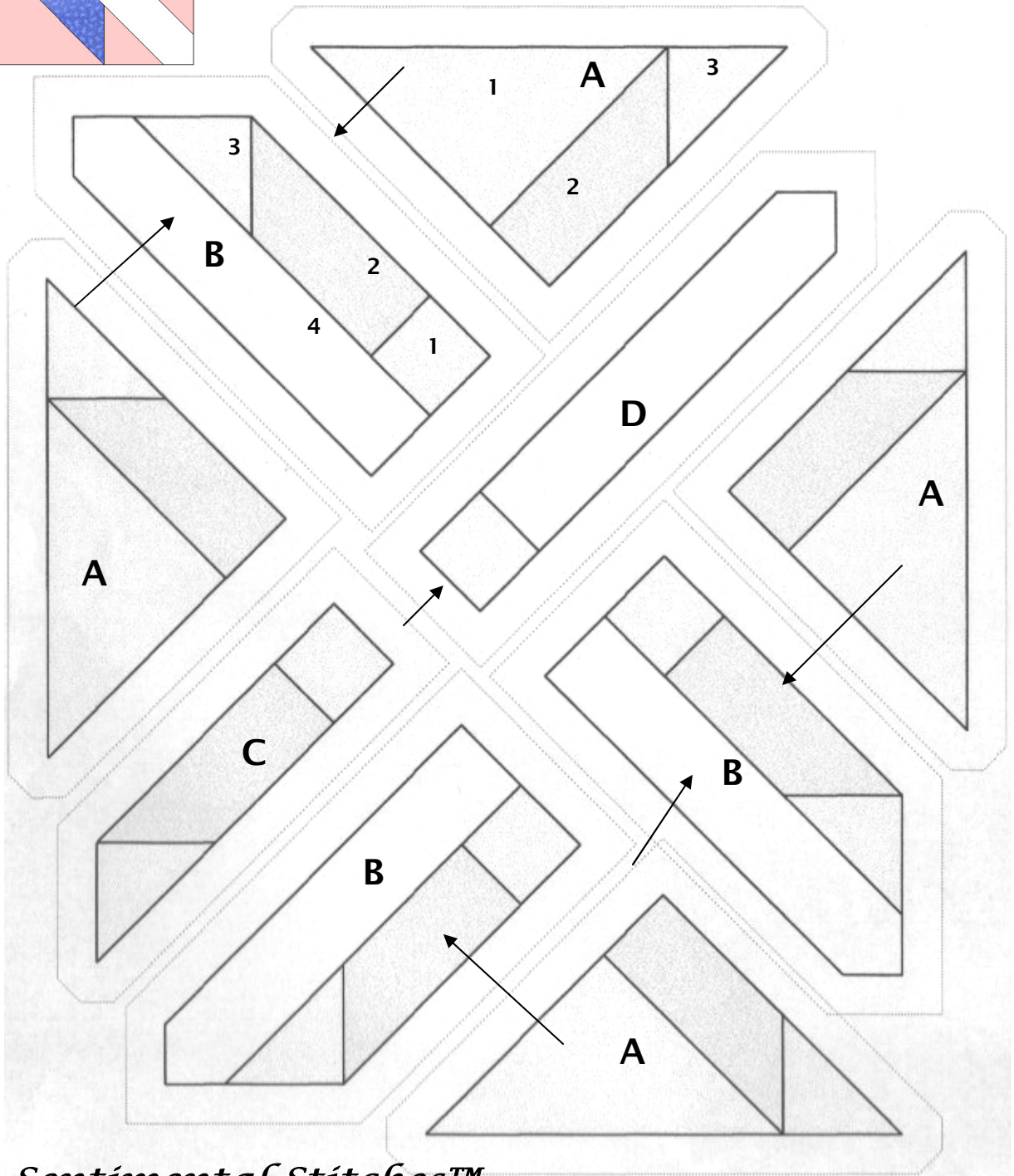
Mexican Star—4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the seventh block from the left in the sixteenth.



1. Foundation paper piece 4 section "A", 4 section "B", 1 each of section "C" and "D".
2. Sew sections together as indicated by arrows. You'll have two large triangle units made up from sections "A" and "B". You'll have a strip unit made up from sections "C" and "D".
3. Sew a large triangle to each side of the strip unit to complete the block.

Your unfinished block should measure 5"



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
