

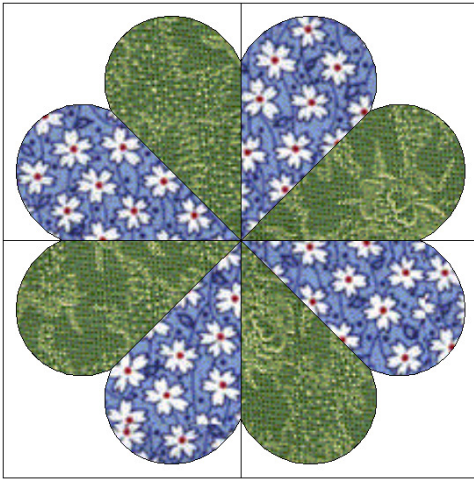
Midget Blocks—Block 70

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

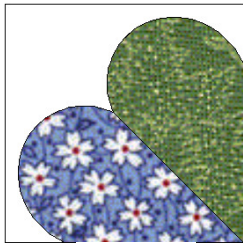
Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a green solid, blue print and the background fabric.

Four Leaf Clover—4 1/2"

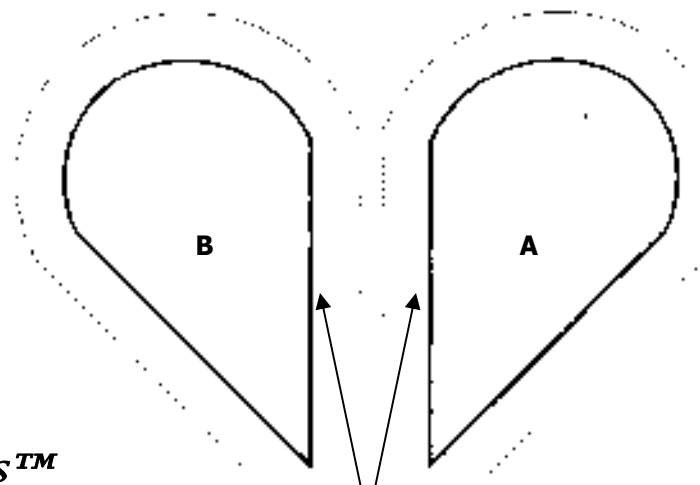
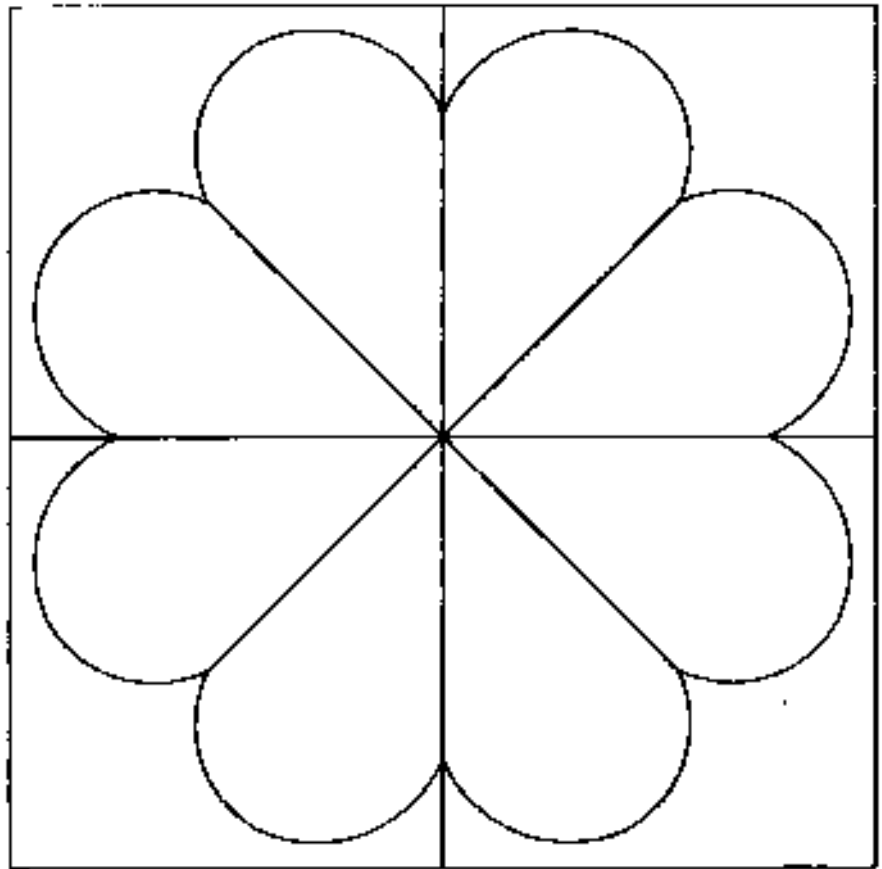
In the antique quilt this block is the eleventh block from the left in the seventh row.



1. From background fabric cut four 3" squares.
2. From template A cut four blue print fabric.
3. From template B cut four green fabric.
4. Sew a print A to a green B on the line indicated, stopping your stitching 1/4" from end of the seam at the curved top.
5. Applique the top curved edge of an AB unit to each of the background squares.
6. Sew squares together to complete the block.
7. Trim completed block to measure 5".



Make 4



Your unfinished block should measure 5"



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Sew these edges together stopping 1/4" from top.

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
