

Midget Blocks—Block 76

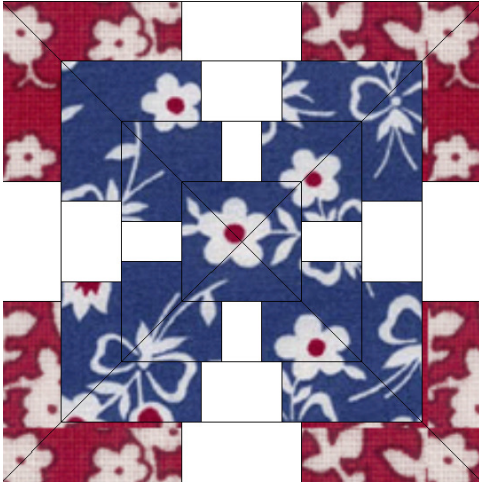
Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a red print, blue print and the background fabric.

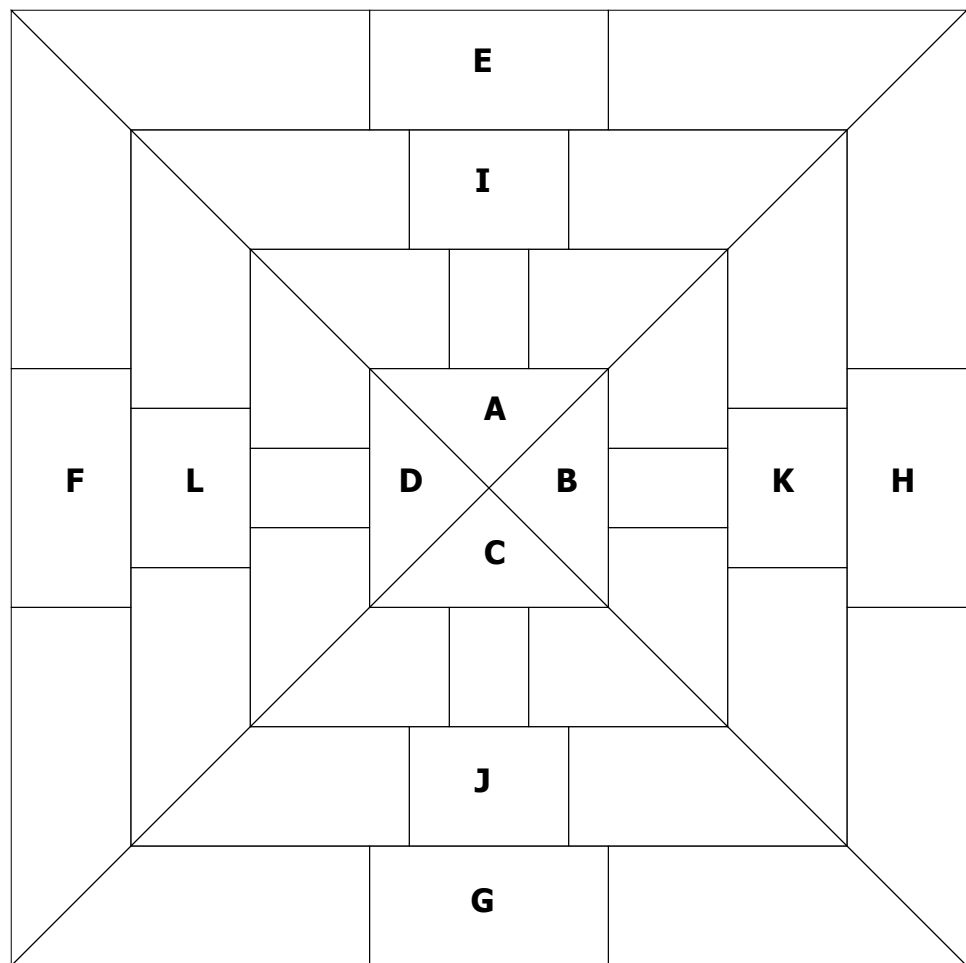
White House Steps—4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the second block from the left in the third row.

This block is well suited for foundation paper piecing



- Foundation piece sections A, I and E.
- Sew together to form a triangle which is 1/4 of the entire block.
- Repeat with sections B, K and H. Then C, J and G and finally D, L, and F.
- Sew the large pieced triangles together in pairs.
- Complete the block by sewing the halves together along the final long diagonal seam.



Your unfinished block should measure 5"

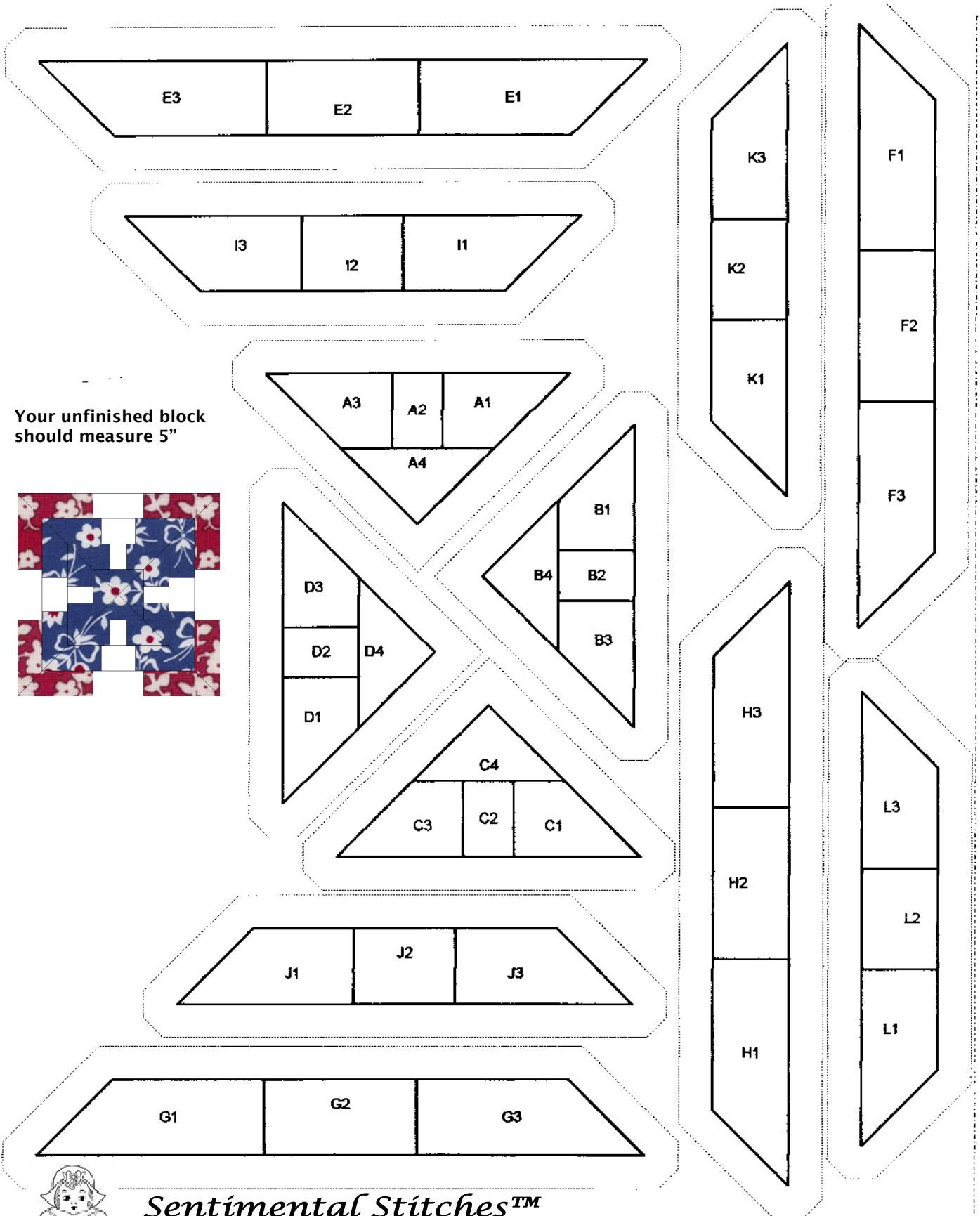


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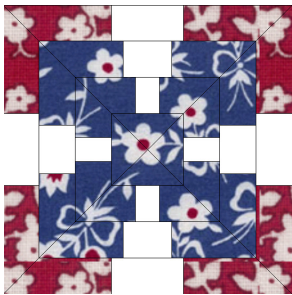
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
