

Midget Blocks—Block 79


Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original guilt was constructed using a blue print, pink solid, blue solid and the background fabric. (I used a pink print instead of a pink solid when making may block)

Diamond Cross—4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the sixth block from the left in the fourteenth row.

This block is well suited for machine and foundation piecing.

Your unfinished block should measure 5"



Sentimental Stitches™

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Background-

Cut 4 rectangles approximately 2" x 3" to be used in foundation piecing.

Pink:

Cut 2 rectangles 1 1/8" x 1 3/4"

Cut 2 squares approximately 2" to be used in foundation piecing. Cut 1 rectangle 1 1/8" x 3 3/4".

Blue solid:

Cut 8 squares 1 1/8". Cut 4 squares 2" to be used in foundation piecing.

Blue print:

Cut 8 squares 1 1/8"

- Using the blue print and blue solid 1 1/8" squares, sew together four little Four Patch blocks. See fig. "A".
- Sew the little Four Patch blocks together using the pink rectangles like sashing strips. See fig. "B".
- Using the blue solid squares, pink squares and background rectangles, foundation piece the four strips. See fig. "C".
- Sew the foundation pieced strips to the center unit just like adding a border and your block is complete. See fig. "D".

This line should measure 1" after printing pattern.

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
