

Midget Blocks—Block 80

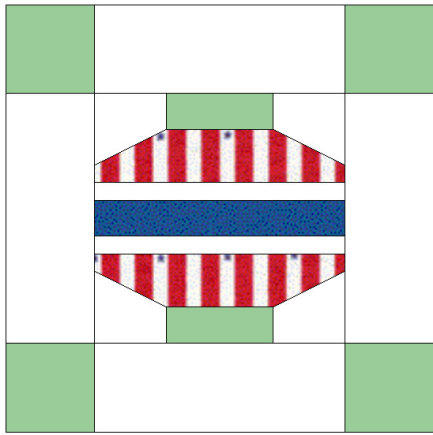
Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a blue solid, green solid, red print and the background fabric.

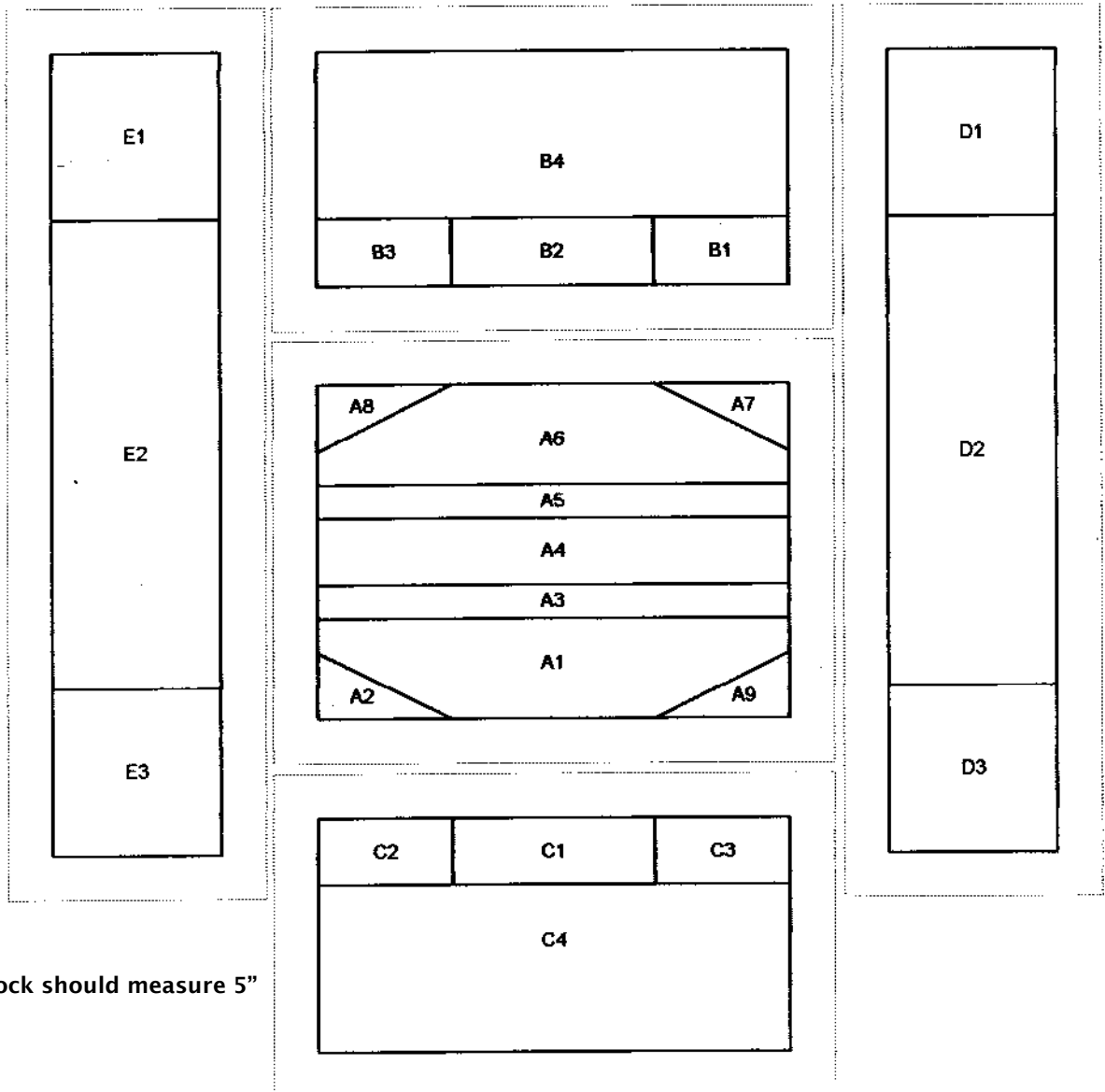
Japanese Garden—4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the tenth block from the left in the sixteenth row.

This block is well suited for foundation and machine piecing.



- Foundation piece center "A", "B" and "C" sections.
- Sew the "B" section to the top of "A".
- Sew the "C" section to the bottom of "A".
- Foundation piece sections "D" and "E".
- Sew section "E" to the left side of center unit.
- Sew section "D" to the right side of center unit to complete the block.



Your unfinished block should measure 5"



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This line should measure 1" after printing pattern.

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
