

# Midget Blocks—Block 85

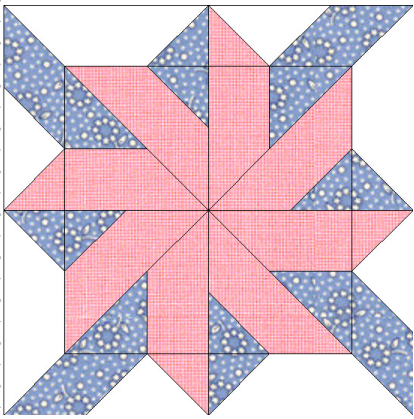
Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using a pink solid, blue solid and background fabric.

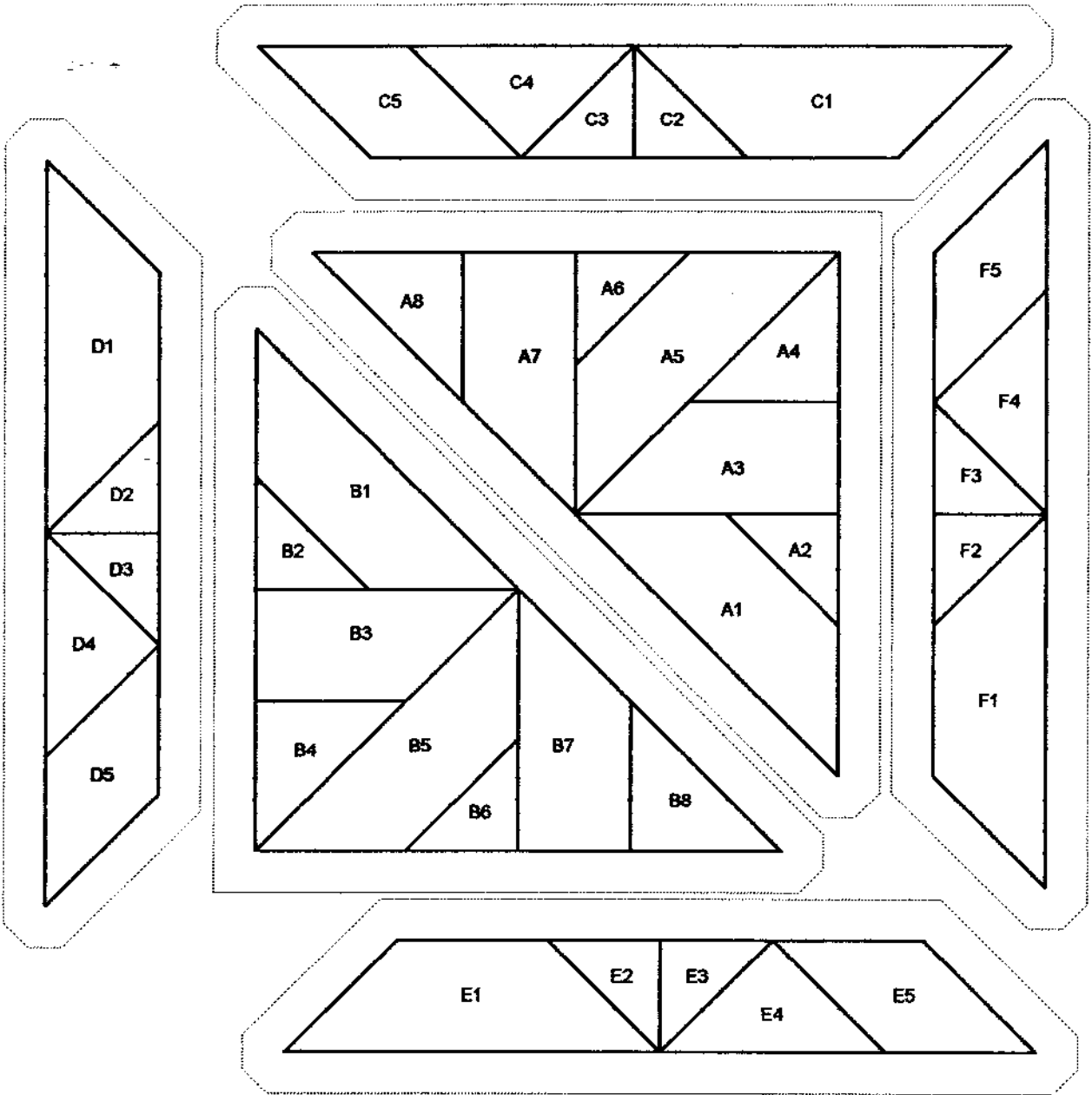
## Whirling Star- 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the sixth from the left in the fifteenth row.

This block is well suited for foundation piecing



- Foundation piece sections A—F.
- Sew unit A to B forming center square.
- Sew units C—F to outside edges of center square, stopping stitching 1/4" from each end of the seam.
- Sew the diagonal seam at each corner to complete the block.



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Your unfinished block should measure 5"

This line should measure 1" after printing pattern.

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
