

Midget Blocks—Block 104

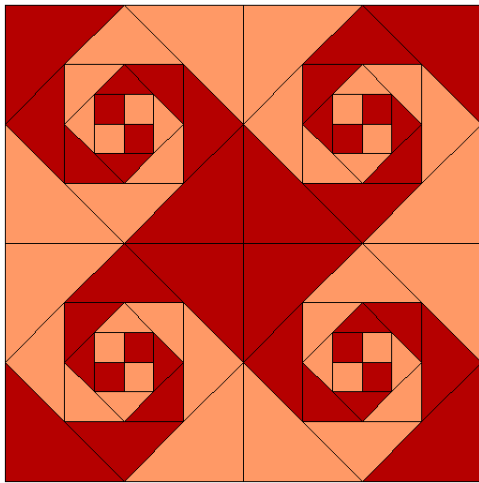
Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using solid red and peach fabrics


Snail Trail- 4 1/2"

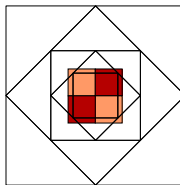
In the antique quilt this block is the third block from the left in the twelfth row.

This block is well suited for foundation piecing

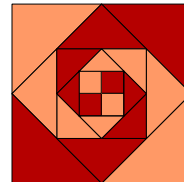


Cutting: Cut eight 1" squares from red fabric and eight squares from peach fabric.

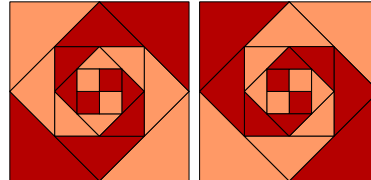
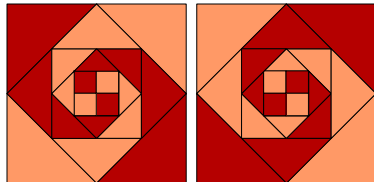
- Sew the red and peach 1" squares together into four 4-Patch blocks. 
- Begin the foundation piecing on each square by centering one of the 4-Patch blocks in the middle of the section.



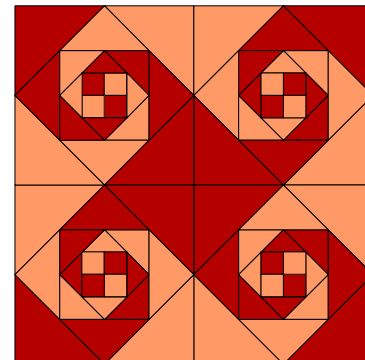
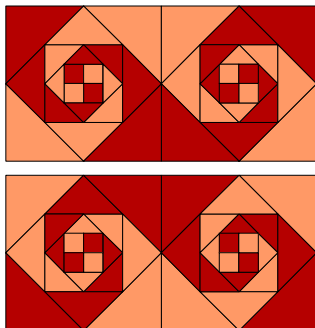
Make 4 like this



- Rotating the square sections as necessary for color placement, sew sections together in pairs.



- Sew the rows together to complete the block



Your unfinished block should measure 5"



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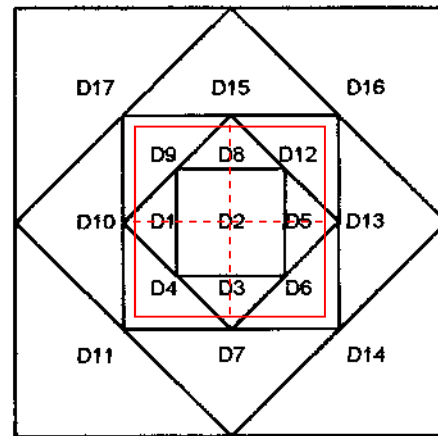
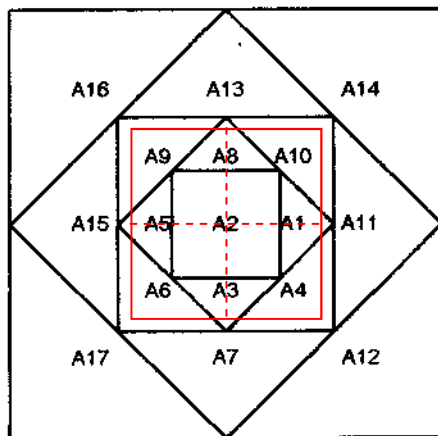
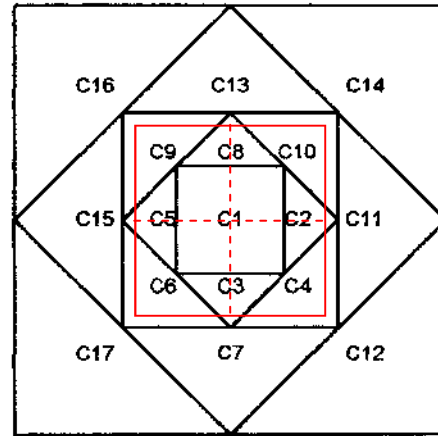
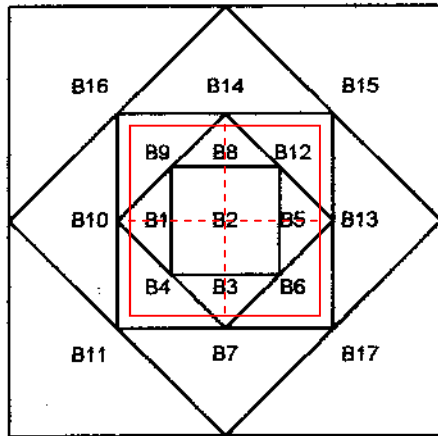
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This line should
