

## Midget Blocks—Block 96

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.
Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using pink solid, blue solid and the background fabric.
I chose to use prints for my illustration.
1929 World's Fair - 4 1/2"
In the antique quilt this block is the tenth block from the left in the fourteenth row.
This block is well suited for foundation piecing

## Fabrics-

If you have a fat $1 / 8$ th ( 9 " $\times 22$ ") of each color you'll have plenty for your foundation piecing

- Foundation piece the eight sections of the block $\mathbf{A}$
- Sew the eight sections in pairs forming the four blue points B
- Sew the four units in pairs C
- Sew the square point units together to form the two halves of the block D
- Sew the long seam down the middle to complete the block $\mathbf{E}$
