

## Midget Blocks—Block 105

Midget Blocks are a series of wonderful little blocks adapted from an antique sampler quilt made during the 1930s. I hope you'll enjoy making these blocks and a sampler quilt of your own.

Most of these blocks were made using just two colors. A print or solid color and the background fabric. This block in the original quilt was constructed using bright pink, blue solids and the background fabric.

### Missouri Puzzle- 4 1/2"

In the antique quilt this block is the ninth block from the left in the sixteenth row.

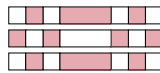
This block is well suited for foundation piecing

#### Note:

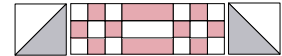
While this block would usually be rotary cut and machine pieced, the very small pieces with 1/6th inch measurements are more accurately assembled by foundation piecing.

- Foundation piece units A through M. *Save the square A unit until later.*

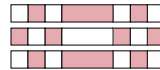
- Sew units D—E and F together



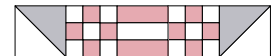
- Sew unit K to the top of the D/E/F section and unit L to the bottom



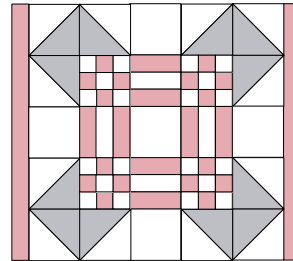
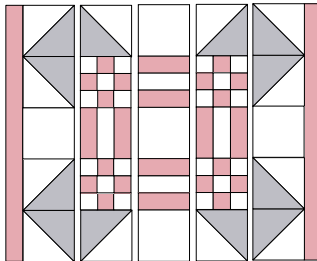
- Sew units G—H and I together



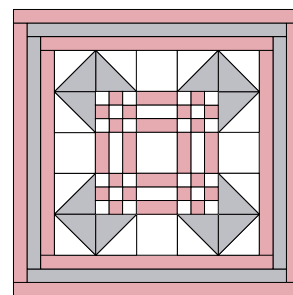
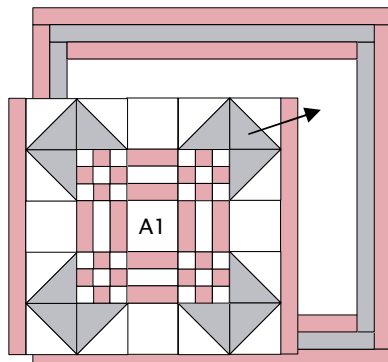
- Sew unit J to the top of the G/H/I section and unit M to the bottom



- Sew together the vertical rows making up the center of the block



- Using the square A unit foundation paper, center the pieced section within the A1 square of the paper and foundation piece the remaining border strips to complete the block.



Your unfinished block should measure 5"

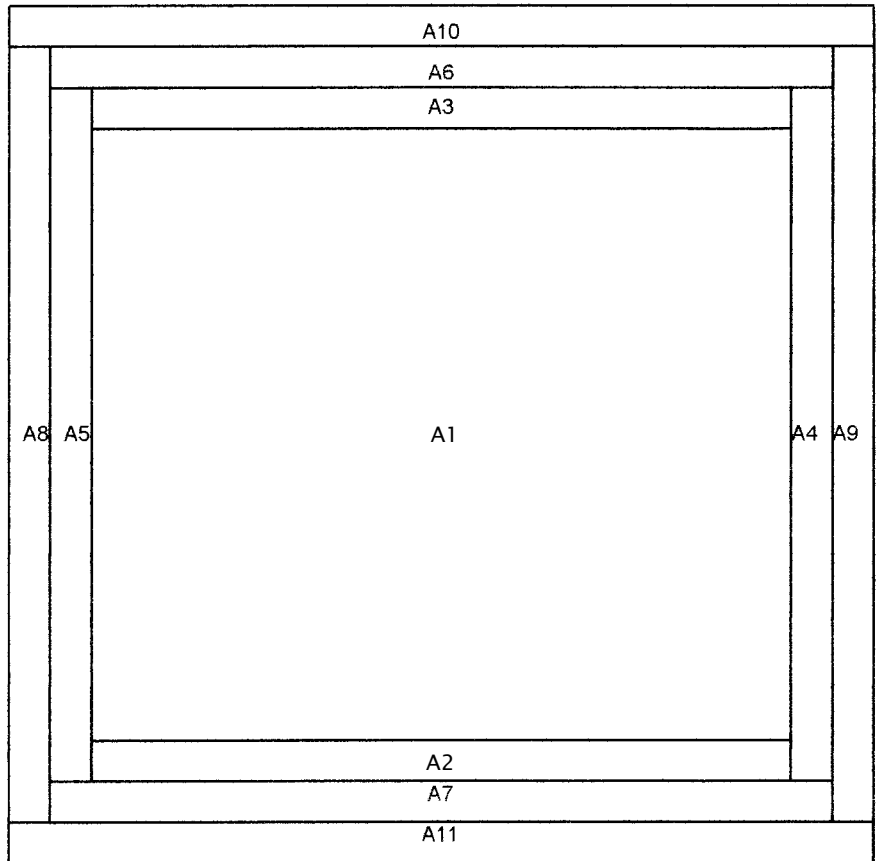
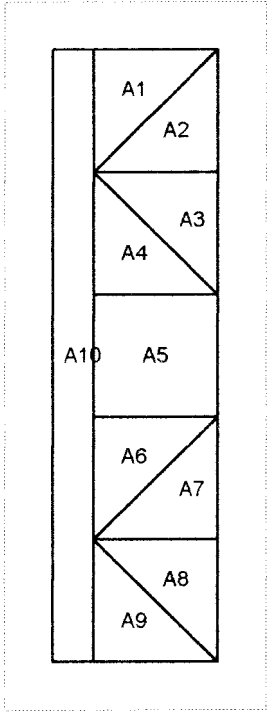
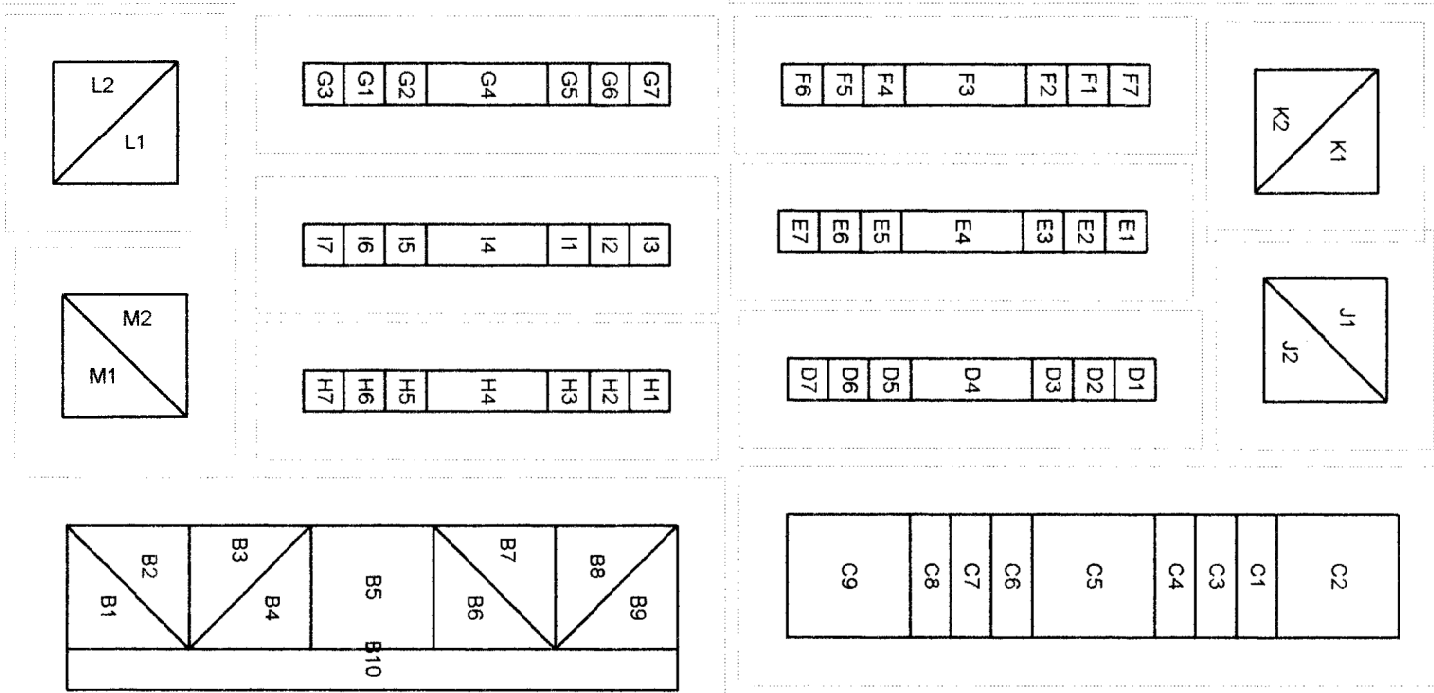
