

Tulip Bouquet

Materials

Background fabric— 2 1/2 yards
Flower fabric - 3/4 yard
Leaf fabric — 1 1/4 yards
Flower centers— 1/4 yard
Backing—1 1/4 yards
Binding— 1/3 yard
Batting—crib size
Basic quilting supplies
Papers for Foundation Piecing




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

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Finished size - 34" square
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This pattern assumes you have basic quilting knowledge and basic foundation paper piecing knowledge.

1. From the enclosed foundation paper piecing pattern, make 24 copies on the foundation paper of your choice. My favorite is Foundation Piecing Papers from That Patchwork Place.
2. From black background fabric for Piece #1—cut twenty four $2\frac{1}{4}$ " squares.
3. From gray flower center fabric for Piece #2—cut twenty four $2\frac{1}{4}$ " squares.
4. From black background fabric for Piece #3—cut twenty four rectangles $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 4"
5. From red flower fabric for Piece #4—cut twenty four rectangles $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 4"
6. From black background fabric for Piece #5—cut twenty four squares $2\frac{1}{2}$ " and sub-cut in half diagonally one way. Use 24 of the triangles for Piece #5 and save the remaining 24 triangles for Piece #7.
7. From red flower fabric for Piece #6—cut 24 rectangles $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6".
8. From green leaf fabric for Piece #8—cut 24 rectangles $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6"
9. From green leaf fabric for Piece #9—cut 24 rectangles $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7"
10. From black background fabric for Piece #10—cut 24 squares $2\frac{1}{2}$ " and sub cut in half diagonally one way. Use 24 of the triangles for Piece #10 and save the remaining 24 triangles for Piece #11.
11. Foundation piece your twenty four blocks following the numerical order printed on the foundation pattern.
12. Cut 4 squares $9\frac{3}{4}$ " and sub cut in half diagonally both ways to yield sixteen setting triangles.
13. Piece blocks and setting triangles together according to the diagram shown on the right.
14. Cut backing and batting 40" square. Layer backing, batting and top.
15. Quilt as desired. We just quilted "in the ditch" around the blocks.
16. Bind raw edges with single fold binding cut from background fabric. You'll need 4 strips cut $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x width of fabric.


