

### **Cathedral Window**

You will enjoy the relative simplicity of constructing Cathedral Window using rotary cutting and paper piecing techniques. Just look at all that space for beautiful embroidery!

Your unfinished block will measure 15-1/2 inches

For ease in construction, we are dividing the center block into a 9-patch and will make it first . This center block measures 10.5 inched unfinished.



## Rotary cutting the four corner sections

#### Cut

### Background (white)


- Cut four strips 1.5 X 2.5 inches
- Cut four strips 1.5 X 3.5 inches

## Color (red)

Cut four squares 2.5 inches

#### Assemble






### Make four sections



#### Cathedral Window







#### Background (white)

#### <u>Cut</u>

- Four- 2.5 inch squares, cross cut one diagonal
- One-4 inch square, cross cut both diagonals

#### Color (red)

#### <u>Cut</u>

Two-4 inch squares, cross-cut on both diagonals

#### <u>Cut</u>


Sixteen-3 X 1.75 inch rectangles






Sixteen 2.25 inch squares, crosscut one diagonal



















Make 4 sections





## Pre-cutting for paper piecing

### Background (white):


Cut

Two 3 inch squares cross cut on one diagonal - yields 4 triangles

### Color (red):

Cut

One 3 inch square for center




This line should measure 1" after printing pattern.

You now have all the sections to assemble Cathedral Window as the nine-patch shown on the first page. Your unfinished 9-patch section will measure 10.5 inches. Instructions for completing Block 29 are on the following page.



# **Complete Block 29**

- Cut two 9 inch squares and cross cut on one diagonal to yield four triangles
- Stitch two triangles on opposite corners of the square and press toward triangles
- Stitch the remaining two triangles on the other two sides of the square and press toward triangles.

Voila! Wonderful space for embroidery in those corner triangles!

Trim block to 15.5 inches. If doing embroidery, wait until it is finished before you trim.

#### Cut

### Background (white)

Cut two 3 inch squares and cross cut on one diagonal for the four corner triangles

# Color (red)

Cut one 2.5 inch square

Assemble block as shown and trim to 3.5 inches
